Dear Trinity Church Family and Friends,

The new year is upon us, and so is that "wonderful" tradition of making New Year's resolutions—you know those promises about improving or changing our lives that we make in the morning on January 1, and break by evening of January 2. Those resolutions usually involve changes in habits that will improve physical health and well-being such as eating fewer cookies and pizza, and eating more lettuce; walking around the block instead of sitting in the lazy boy, and drinking more water instead of pop. Some people even challenge themselves to improve their minds by watching less TV and reading more good books. Once in a while resolutions are more altruistic-finding ways to be kinder to and helpful

toward others. Perhaps the best resolution was made by a friend of mine who resolved not to make any resolutions and thereby avoid the guilt that always comes with failure to keep the resolutions.

Need some "attitude adjustments": "Be joyful always., pray at all times, be thankful in all circumstances. This is what God wants of you, in your life in Christ Jesus", (I Thessalonians 5: 16)

Or how about this: BLESS THE LORD O MY SOUL, BLESS HIS HOLY NAME, EVERY DAY, IN EVERY WAY, BLESS THE LORD O MY SOUL!!!

The meaning of Epiphany

EPIPHANY REFLECTIONS

Epiphany begins on January 6 each year. It gets its name from the Greek word epiphaneia, meaning "to appear, to show or to manifest." The ending date of the Epiphany season is determined by Ash Wednesday, which is determined by the date of Easter.

Traditionally, Epiphany Day marks the coming of the Magi to worship the infant Jesus. The significance of Epiphany for Christians is that it symbolizes the first recognition of Christ by non-Jews. The season of Epiphany emphasizes the divine nature of Jesus - a truth that justifies his perfection as the model of real life.

The color of Epiphany is green to symbolize life, growth, hope and eternity, which are all characteristics of the Epiphany emphasis.

Epiphany of the Lord

In the early church, January 6 was a day for baptism. The central significance of Epiphany is that Christ came as the Light of the World, not just for the Jews but for Gentiles as well. Christ's light is for all.

In France, to celebrate Epiphany, children from Christian homes often put oats in their shoes on the evening before January 6. The oats are for the camels of the "Wise Men." When they awake the next morning, the children hope to find the oats gone and gifts left in their shoes.
