REFLECTIONS

ABOUT EASTER/RESURRECTION SUNDAY—JESUS CHRIST HAS VICTORY OVER DEATH

I had a seminary professor who used to say that 'the true symbol of the Christian faith is an empty tomb, not a cross"...and then with a twinkle in his eye he would add, "but it is hard to make pretty jewelry and lovely altar ware that resembles an empty tomb".

However he was correct. The holy day, probably the most holy day, in Christendom, is not the day Jesus died on the cross, but the day celebrated as the day He rose from the dead! Had that event not occurred, the death of Jesus on a cross would have been, in the eyes of the world, just one more execution of a possibly deranged prophet/preacher. It is the resurrection of Jesus that sets Christianity apart from most other world religions. It is in the resurrection of Jesus that God completes His promises—and God always keeps His promises.

In doing some research and study about Easter I ran across this simple summary of Easter on the internet. It is NOT my original thought and I certainly would give appropriate credit IF I could find the article again.

The Empty Tomb reveals God is FAITHFUL. God keeps God's promises.

The Empty Tomb reveals God is POWERFUL. God brought His Son back from the dead

The Empty Tomb reveals that God is LOVING. .. not that we love God but that God loves us

The Empty Tomb guarantees ETERNITY. Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life; those who believe in me will live, even though they die!"

The Empty Tomb guarantees DELIVERY..God will meet every need from now until you see Him face to face.

It is becoming more accepted to call Easter Sunday Resurrection Sunday in part because that really is what it is, and in part because the word "Easter" closely resembles the name of a cultic spring goddess "Eastre".

Resurrection Sunday is celebrated with processions, with shouts of "Alleluia! Now Is Christ Risen From the Dead" and often with trumpet fanfares and even drums. Historically it was the day recent converts to the faith were baptized. It ushers in the Great Fifty Days,
