Youth--Nothing new to report Worship--Subbing for Barb was discussed. Hopefully Kim Breamer and Tanner Mammenga will be able to help us out.

Pastor Krista--Trinity will be hosting Hope for Heartland on February 2. The Equipping Congregations gathering will meet in Willmar on February 23. Bulletins and a projector/TV screen were discussed. 

What you do:


- Set the sticks side by side. Secure with two tape strips.

Chi Rho

"Chi" and "rho" are the first two letters in the Greek spelling for Christ

(XPICTOC, pronounced "Christos"). The blending of these two letters into one symbol formed a "sacred monogram." Early Christians created many such symbols as codes to indicate their discipleship while avoiding detection by Roman persecutors. Many variations of the Chi Rho symbol exist, incorporating a cross, a shepherd's crook, the Greek letters alpha and omega, an anchor and other images.'
