January 19 -Asking the question

Present: Arlene Peterson, Jan Ringeisen, Heather Tonkin, Clayton Duncanson, Grant Hartman, Dallas Wegner, Laurie Wille, Teresa Zaharia, Nikki Smith, Cathy Sorenson President Grant called the meeting to order. The secretary's report was approved as read. Clayton presented the treasurer's report. There is \$3589 in the checking account and \$75,615 in the savings account. We had a net gain of \$1547 in the month of November!

BOARD REPORTS:

Stewardship-- Arlene reported that the Pony Express response so far is \$86,706. We hope that more pledges will be received.

Lay Ministry--Noting new to report. They are still sending cards. Church properties--Dallas expressed his gratitude to the committee working on the shingle project. We are all grateful to Brad Nickerson and Grant for the work they have done. The committee is extremely happy with the response from the congregation. The bid from Fairmont Roofing to do the project was accepted.

Christian education--The Christmas program and supper will be next Wednesday, December 18 at 5:30. Last week we had 46 students attend GIFT! There will be a 2 week break and GIFT will resume on January 8.

Youth--They are working on the mission trip for next summer. Several 7-8-9 graders went to Willmar on the Confirmation retreat and had

a good time.

Worship--The committee will use the Time and Talent sheet and work on a schedule for ushers, lay readers and communion servers.

Pastor Krista--no report OLD BUSINESS:

Vets Glass has been contacted and they have ordered a new glass for the back door.

NEW BUSINESS:

The nursing home is looking for volunteers to deliver Meals on Wheels in town. This is a flexible commitment. More information in the Messenger.

Yvonne turned in the report for the nominating committee and all offices have been filled. Spots are still open for synod delegates and nominating committee if anyone is interested in serving on them. This is not a big time commitment

The council worked on the budget for 2020 and tried to pair costs down as much as possible.

Special congregational meeting, Sunday's November 17 & December 8, 2019

After the church service, Grant Hartman called the meeting to order. Grant named the roof committee members and explained the events leading up to our roof problems.

Roof committee members: Grant Hartman, Duke Drevlow, Dallas Wegner, Brad Nickerson, Dave Sorenson, Veryle Williamson, Dennis Rode and Duane Heckman.

2 bids were explained. For over the flat roof of the entryway, it would cost \$10,000 to put on the same kind of flat roof we have had, and \$16,200 to put on a sloped foam that would send the water toward the street with the roof membrane on top of that.

To do the rest of the roof there were also 2 bids. Asphalt shingles would cost \$71,000. Steel shingles would cost \$118,000 but would have a 50 year non-prorated warranty. We have about \$70,000 from insurance and a current roof fund. It would cost approximately \$98,000 in 20 years to redo the asphalt

shingles again. Grant explained that the committee recommends having the congregation pledge what they could give toward a new roof over 2 years, and see what the numbers look like before we commit to a plan. Grant explained that we will recess this meeting until December 8, giving the congregation time to think about a pledge and have Thanksgiving. There will be a box in the back for people to give a pledge, and this can be anonymous. If we get pledges, we can lock in prices now even if the work isn't done until summer. Discussion followed. Comments included that this is over and above our normal giving, that we will still have to give toward the regular offering that goes toward bills. How many of our members give toward the church? We will know more after the regular stewardship packets are in. A comment made at council is that the people who helped build this church, and also the new addition didn't have extra money either, but they made it happen. We need faith and prayer. Another comment was that many of our members are on a fixed income. How long is the longevity for a flat roof like we have now? 20 years is a guess, and it may need upkeep before that. The option of steel sheets was asked about, and Grant said the committee feels this isn't the best option because of the bolts needing to go through the roof and they would show. The price would be between the cost of asphalt shingles and steel shingles. Steel shingles have hidden fasten-

With no more discussion, Jerry Teig moved to recess the meeting until Dec. 8 and Dallas Wegner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Darrell Buhmann made the motion and Darrell Drevlow made the second to go with the steel shingle roof option. The motion carried with a hands up vote. Darrell Drevlow made a motion to adjourn and Teresa Zaharia made the second.
